



### **Amazing facts about the 3 metro Denver Habitat ReStores**

The ReStores are absolutely critical to Habitat Metro Denver's fiscal health and to HFHMD's ability to serve more families, making the dream of homeownership a reality in our neighborhoods.

- The ReStores are open to the public and sell new and used donated building materials and home furnishings to raise money for Habitat for Humanity.
- Individuals can donate, shop or volunteer at the 3 area ReStores. Donations are picked up by our Habitat trucks at no cost to the donor.
- Annually, the ReStores cover 96.8 – 100% of the administrative and fund raising costs of Habitat Metro Denver. What does this mean to our financial supporters?
- Habitat Metro Denver is building 70% more homes as a result of the revenue generated by the ReStores.
- The ReStores did 89 Deconstructions in 2011, keeping valuable materials from landfill and raising thousands of dollars for HFHMD. Deconstructions are run by a staff manager working with a volunteer team. Deconstructions are done at no cost to the home or property owner.
- The 3 ReStores operate with approximately 90% volunteer labor and 10% staff keeping our costs low so more of the revenue generated is passed back to HFHMD.
- The 2 ReStores are major recyclers of goods and materials keeping approximately 5 tons of material out of landfill every week. This number will increase dramatically in 2012 as the Littleton ReStore numbers are added.
- There are over 700 Habitat ReStores in the United States and the Denver area ReStores are number 3 (of over 700) in sales generated and number 2 in net revenue. We are a Super Bowl team.
- We receive 2800 calls per month at the ReStore call center. In 2011 the 2 ReStores had 48% increase in pick-ups and a 16% in drop offs.
